

TIDALHEALTH EDWARD Q. WILGUS COMMUNITY CLINIC

SALISBURY, MARYLAND

Gillis Gilkerson is honored to have played a role in the construction of TidalHealth Edward Q. Wilgus Community Clinic in Salisbury's historic Church Street neighborhood. The community clinic will be staffed by TidalHealth primary and specialty care providers, serving as a bridge intended to reconnect residents and healthcare resources. The clinic will also serve as a home base for TidalHealth's resident physicians specializing in internal medicine.

The project redeveloped a historically significant two-acre parcel that was the site of a boarding house known as 'Hotel Esther'. The building had formerly been the residence of Dr. Robert Naylor, a prominent physician who purchased the property in 1893 with the intent of turning the home into Salisbury's first hospital. Now 130 years later the vision has been realized, with a state-of-the-art, 16,500 square foot community clinic complete with twenty-two exam rooms, a large community room, provider offices, residents and nursing stations, a conference room, and dedicated spaces for financial and behavior health counseling.
